

Medicare Now Offers FREE INTERNET Access For Personal Health Records

At our recently concluded Federation's Annual Convention, held at Hickory Knob State park, I announced that (CMS) Medicare had just introduced a pilot project, specific to South Carolinians, that offers free access to an Electronic Personal Health Record called My Personal Health Record, South Carolina (MyPHRSC). This one year project, sponsored by Medicare, offers a person with Medicare living in South Carolina an opportunity to create their own Personal Health Record at no expense to them.

- A Personal Health Record (PHR) is a tool that helps you to collect and store important medical information about yourself. It can be helpful in an **emergency** since **MyPHRSC** provides you, your trusted caregivers and your authorized providers with a comprehensive view of your medical history. You have a choice in determining who has access to your records. A condensed medical history is available on a wallet-card printout feature, which is convenient for immediate identification purposes by all Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT's).
- My Personal Health Record, South Carolina (MyPHRSC) allows you to view a history of your Medicare claims over the past 24 months, in a very attractive format. MyPHRSC provides you with one convenient location to track your Medicare provider and hospital visits, medical conditions, allergies, and additional information.
 - You can also add your own notes, the medications you take, immunizations, allergies, and any non-Medicare appointments to your record. **MyPHRSC** will help you better understand your health and the services you use.

- Signing up for MyPHRSC is easy to do and only takes a few minutes of your time. There is no fee for this service. All you need is internet access (a personal e-mail address*), your Medicare number and some basic information about yourself. It is important to note that MyPHRSC follows strict security measures to ensure all of your information is safe and secure.

- 6. Click the Continue button
- 7. Click the **Inbox** to check your email

NATIONAL NARFE CONVENTION - LOUISVILLE, KY

Leavery two years since 1950, NARFE members have gathered to set the Association's course during the next two years. This year, Louisville, KY, plays host to the 30th

Biennial NARFE National Convention, September 7-11. This is the second time the convention has been held in Louisville. The last time was in 1990.

Not surprising for a gathering held in the Kentucky Derby City, the 2008 convention takes its theme, "NARFE: Going the Distance for Your Future," from the sporting world. Convention planners think they have a Triple Crown-winning event for NARFE delegates to enjoy.

- First, the convention schedule is being streamlined.
- Second, all convention activities will be conducted under one roof.
- Third, the convention hotel's downtown location is within walking distance of many attractions.



The convention program is being designed to try to ensure that delegates complete all convention business within the allotted time. As usual, most of the convention business will take place on the main convention floor, where delegates will debate and signal acceptance or rejection of resolutions and committee reports. The Convention will be held in The Galt House Hotel & Suites, which recently underwent a \$60 million refurbishing. It has comfortably sized rooms; several restaurants, including a revolving rooftop restaurant; and all of the amenities of a large hotel. The Galt House consists of two towers joined by a covered walkway above the street between the buildings.

The walkway features conversation areas, tables and a deli. The Convention will not be held in a convention center, but in the Hotel itself.

Delegates also will have the opportunity to attend the convention's Kentucky Night, being planned by the Host Committee. It will spotlight the bicentennial of President Abraham Lincoln's birth near Hodgenville, KY, on Feb. 12, 1809. There will be a number of optional events and tours, including a dinner cruise on the Belle of Louisville on the Saturday evening before the convention and representatives of the Louisville Convention & Visitors Bureau will be on-site to help delegates arrange their own tours.

EMERGENCY CONTACT

Ever heard of ICE? It stands for In Case of Emergency! Paramedics know about it, and if you use a mobile phone, you should too. Store the word "ICE" in your mobile phone address book. Against it, enter the phone number of the person to contact "IN CASE OF EMERGENCY." For more than one contact, enter ICE1, ICE2, etc. In case of an emergency, paramedics or anyone that knows about ICE can simply use the 'call' button to notify your emergency contact. It works!
