The 45th Annual SC NARFE Federation Convention will be held April 22,23 and 24, 2009, At the Holiday Inn & Suites, 2225 Boundary Street, Beaufort, South Carolina 29902. The theme of this year's convention is "One Voice- Securing Our Future."



The registration fee is \$75 per person and must be received by March 20, 2009. After March 20th, the fee is \$85 per person and subject to space availability and prevailing room rates. discover Southern hospitality and charm at the new Holiday Inn Hotel Beaufort, nestled in the heart of South Carolina's Low country. Our location is just off Highway 170 and Route 21 and overlooks the Beaufort River in Beaufort, SC, an antebellum seaside town surrounded by history and beauty.



Beaufort's downtown is rich in history and just one mile away. Enjoy a relaxing and educational horse-drawn buggy tour to discover the secrets of historic Beaufort. And it's easy to spend a day on the inter-coastal waterways of Seabrook Island or Hilton Head Island, as both are just a half-hour away. Our guests can relax around our indoor heated pool & whirlpool or enjoy a workout in the fitness center. A 24-hour business center allows you to catch up on work or check your email. Must See: Henry C. Chambers Waterfront Park runs along the Beaufort River with spectacular views of the water, especially at night as you watch the sun disappear over the water. This oldest and most beautiful park is one mile from our hotel in Beaufort.

ALZHEIMER'S RAFFLE GUIDELINES:

1. Sell tickets at chapter meetings--\$1.00 each, or 6 for \$5.00.
2. Attach a label to your raffle item. Example: Beaufort Ch. 1021, nut tray.
3. Label ticket holder container exactly as raffle item. Example: Beaufort Ch. 1021, nut tray.
Be sure each ticket has the name and chapter # of person buying that ticket.
4. Bring raffle item and ticket holder container to the Convention in April.
5. Place tickets sold at Chapter meetings in a zip lock bag and label exactly as raffle item.
Example Beaufort Ch. 1021, nut tray. Bring your tickets to the Convention in the zip lock bag.
Tickets sold at the Convention for your item will be combined with tickets in the zip lock bag before the drawing for your item.
6. I will provide a roll of tickets to be sold at convention. Each ticket will cost \$1. 00 at convention.
7. Do not bring any ticket money from chapter sales to the convention. Please give Chapter ticket sales money to your Chapter treasurer for deposit. He/she will write a check and mail to me.

If your chapter donates more than one item to be raffled, please follow the procedures as stated above for each item donated.

NARFE - FEEA REPORT

The Federal Employees Education and Assistance (FEEA) Program provides educational and disaster assistance to federal employees and retirees.

Disaster Fund: During the past year the Disaster fund has received many requests for financial aid due to hurricanes Gustov and Ike. Other financial aid requests were received because of the forest fires in Southern California. Margaret Baptiste, NARFE National President made an appeal for donations to FEEA. Some Chapters and individuals have contributed but more funds are still needed. Now we are approaching the tax season this may be a good time to consider a donation.

Scholarship Fund: There were seven applicants requesting consideration for a FEEA scholarship. Scores based on applications were very close. There was one incomplete application and two applications that the applicant did not address the essay topic. If you are sponsoring a child or a grandchild it is very important you emphasize the need to provide all documentation requested and address questions and topics requested. Now for the good news, SC had one scholarship winner for a \$1000 award. He is Steven Dyal the son of Bernard Dyal from Chapter 87.
